The core of each workshop, however, are the peer discussions that take place at the "dinner tables," where groups of 5-7 persons, under the guidance of a trained facilitator, explore questions prepared by our team. Participation is always free, and includes a complementary meal. What is the purpose? To bridge ideological division by creating safe spaces for authentic, civil conversations that build understanding and appreciation for different perspectives, and the skills critical to navigating challenging discussions successfully. Over time, our intent is to heal and strengthen the country, by building a national network of CATA Communities.

Building Bridges – Latino Ministries

According to the 2020 census, more than one quarter of the population of Florida is Latino. What's more, while Florida's population overall increased by 14.6% between 2010-2020, the rate of growth for the Latino community was almost 35%. Stated another way, the increase in Florida's Latino populations accounted for more than half of the state's total population growth during the past decade. Many Florida-Bahamas Synod congregations and organizations are in locations well-poised to target this large and growing demographic group. Building Bridges is an exciting, innovative, new ministry designed to bring Latino and Anglo communities together to build God's church. The method has been successful in other contexts and has potential for the Florida-Bahamas Synod.

Building Bridges starts by bringing people together through language: a church holds English classes for Spanish speakers, and Spanish classes for English speakers. Two, ten-week semesters are held each year, with 90-minute classes offered weekly during the series. The classes are accompanied by a meal where all participants join together to practice their language skills and build relationships. Further, a worship experience with a Latino flair may be offered monthly that can include English and Spanish elements. Through conversation, gathering around a meal, learning from each other and worshiping together, a new community can emerge and new activities can take root, where they be Bible studies, cross-cultural events, regularly scheduled worship activities or intergenerational events.

St. Paul received \$10,000 Grant for this ministry. St. Paul will be engaging Alta Vista and Wilkinson Elementary Schools, the Food Pantry clients, and our ECLC for those who want English classes. If you are interested in attending the Spanish classes, please let PrAshley know. We are planning to start after Easter and the classes will be on Thursday evenings in the Fellowship Hall.
