Greetings St. Paul Lutheran Church!

Happy July! When I think of July I think of Independence Day. I remember going to the 4th of July parade in my hometown with my family. My grandpa was a veteran, and I remember him teaching me to stand up and take off my hat when the American flag came by. I really started to get into and doing it every time an American flag came by no matter how big or little it was. I think at one point he had to say, to do it for only when the bigger flags came by, not every car in the parade with a small flag. I was very proud to do that little act to show that I respected, not only what our servicemen and women did for our country, but also to understand how to take pride in our country.

I also grew up a Christian. I followed Jesus' teachings and I often saw Jesus' teachings connected with how we as a country acted. There were rules and laws to keep us safe. We tended to take care of one another. We treated others how you want to be treated. I grew up in a way that to me Christianity was synonymous with being patriotic and vice versa. I understood the founding of our nation was based on Christian principles with the freedom to practice religion however we wanted. I was Lutheran, my grandpa was a Catholic, my baseball coach was part of the Assemblies of God; yep, we can be whatever we want to be. And we all stood and took our hats off as the flag went by at the parade.

Then I went to seminary. Seminary is known for taking what we think of as facts and making us look at them closely to see if they really are facts or just firmly held beliefs that may or may not be true. I remember in one of my papers I wrote that the United States was founded on Christianity and my professor wrote, "was it?". I assumed it was. I always heard that. I knew the nation was founded on religious freedom but I always understood it to mean whatever Christian denomination one wanted to practice. When my professor questioned what I thought was a basic fact, I started to do research. And I was seriously dumbfounded to find out that our nation was founded by, yes Christians, but also Deists (people who believe in God but not necessarily Jesus). The idea of freedom of religion was the idea to be able to practice any form of religion (Christian or not) or no religion. No form of religion would be forced upon anyone. That's what we were founded on. It kind of blew my mind. I didn't really know what to do with that information at first, but as I continued to wrestle with it, it actually deepened my faith and patriotism.

I could now claim both Christianity and patriotism for our country without combining them. So when I saw something that my country does that doesn't align with teachings of Jesus, I can understand why. They don't have to be one and the same. And I can still sing patriotic songs in worship. On July 6 we will have a patriotic service. It's one of my favorites throughout the year. I love being able to be free to sing "God bless America" but also be free to sing "O Beautiful for Spacious Skies" where it says, "May God thy gold refine, till all success be nobleness and every gain divine" and "God mend thine every flaw, confirm thy soul in self-control, thy liberty in law." We have freedom to be able to say our nation isn't perfect and ask for God's help in creating it to be the nation we want it to be.

June Council Report

The Executive Team approved Sandy Tull as one of the two Mid-Gulf Gathering Representatives.

Worship and Music moved to change mid-week services due to reduced attendance for:

- Advent 2025 suspend the midweek Advent worship services except for Blue Christmas.
- Lent 2026 keep services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday and suspend the other mid-week services on the Wednesdays of Lent.

Council approved the Capital Fund outlay for the Fellowship Hall roof repair and shingle treatment in the amount of \$24,303.22. Council also approved the Capital Fund outlay for 2 air conditioning units for the Education Building in the amount of \$18,464.00.

The Fourth of July, also known as Independence Day, is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. This day signifies the formal declaration of the thirteen American colonies' separation from Great Britain and their subsequent birth as a nation. Celebrations often include fireworks, parades, barbecues, and family gatherings, reflecting both patriotic sentiment and the spirit of summer leisure.

Historical Context:

- The Continental Congress voted to declare independence from Great Britain on July 2, 1776, but the Declaration of Independence, drafted primarily by <u>Thomas Jefferson</u>, was officially adopted on July 4th.
- The Declaration outlined the reasons for separation, asserting the rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, and declaring the colonies' status as independent states according to the ConstitutionFacts.com.
- While the signing of the Declaration happened in August, July 4th was the date printed on the <u>Dunlap</u>
 <u>Broadside</u>, the first printed copies distributed throughout the colonies, making it the date widely associated with the event.
- The earliest celebrations involved bonfires, speeches, and the ringing of bells, and later, mock funerals for King George III were also part of the festivities according to Mount Vernon.

Walmart gift cards or the money to purchase the cards will be collected. The dead line is July 27.




