The confirmation students shared their favorite scriptures with me and I reflected upon them. We sang favorite songs. This worship service was our authentic self as a congregation. It’s not perfect, it’s not flashy, but it is real. It’s sharing ourselves, our lives, our very selves. That’s all evangelism is.
