Children's Message

Scripture ~ Genesis 1:1-2:4a

At the beginning of time, God the Creator, God the powerful Word, and God the life-giving Spirit form the earth and all its inhabitants. God sees that all this created work is good and then rests on the seventh day.

¹ When God began to create the heavens and the earth, ² the earth was complete chaos, and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³ Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Let us pray, Dear God of creation, we ask your blessing on Ruby as she enters a new time in her life of faith. Bless her and grant her your baptismal gifts: joy as she lives among your faithful people, openness to hearing Your Word and thankfulness in sharing your supper;

eagerness in sharing the good news of Christ through her words and actions; dedication in serving all people following the example of the Lord Jesus; and a hunger for justice and peace. In Christ's name we pray. Amen.

This prayer shawl has been made with love and given to you as a remembrance of your church family. We thank you and your family for allowing us to join you in celebration of this milestone. The prayer shawl is truly an example of the body of Christ at work at St. Paul. It has been touched by so many people, some donated yarn and other supplies, others made them, and along the way, people who knew Ruby since she was a baby prayed for her. Thanks to all of you.

Ruby, there was a day when your parents held you in their arms and rocked you to sleep. They cuddled you in a quilt to keep you warm, safe, and comforted. Very soon you will be launching a new life, away from the safety and security of this home, family, church, and community. As you go out into the world, may this prayer shawl be a reminder of your family's love and the nurture of this Christian community. Wherever you go, when the night is cold or you feel alone, may it help you remember that you are never alone. Family, please repeat the following blessing after me.

Ruby, we come this day before God to bless you and thank the Creator for the gift you have been to us. Wherever you go, you will always be a part of us. We bless you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. May this prayer shawl remind you of our love, the warmth of this faith community and the power of the Holy Spirit. And on those nights when we cannot wrap you in our arms, may you wrap yourself in this prayer shawl and know that in God's family you are never alone.

Family, please kneel. Ruby, place your hands on your family members' shoulders to bless them by repeating these words: Wherever I go, you will always be a part of me. Whatever I do, I will always be yours and I thank God for blessing my life with you. I bless you in Jesus' name.

Response: Wherever you wander, no matter how dark the night, may the warmth of this prayer shawl, the love of your families, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the fellowship of this church, the power of God, and the presence of the Holy Spirit be with you now and forever. Go with God's blessing. Amen.

Pastor: Let us honor this family and graduate who have kept their promises made to God in baptism with our thanks and applause.

Athanasian Creed

Assisting Minister: Living together in trust and hope, we confess the Athanasian Creed.

Whoever wants to be saved should above all cling to the catholic faith.

Whoever does not guard it whole and inviolable will doubtless perish eternally.

Now this is the catholic faith:

We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being.

For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Spirit is still another.

But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory, coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit.

Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son; uncreated is the Spirit.

The Father is infinite; the Son is infinite; the Holy Spirit is infinite.

Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Spirit:

And yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal;

as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings, but one who is uncreated and unlimited.

Almighty is the Father; all mighty is the Son; almighty is the Spirit:

And yet there are not three almighty beings, but one who is almighty.

Thus the Father is God; the Son is God; the Holy Spirit is God:

And yet there are not three gods, but one God.

Thus the Father is Lord; the Son is Lord; the Holy Spirit is Lord:

And yet there are not three lords, but one Lord.

As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so catholic religion forbids us to say that there are three gods or lords.

The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten;

the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father; the Spirit was neither made nor created, but is proceeding from the Father and the Son.

Thus there is one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three spirits.

And in this Trinity, no one is before or after, greater or less than the other; but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal; and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three persons.

Whoever wants to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.

It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe that our Lord Jesus became flesh.

For this is the true faith that we believe and confess: That our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and he is man, born in the world from the being of his mother— existing fully as God, and fully as man with a rational soul and a human body; equal to the Father in divinity, subordinate to the Father in humanity.

Although he is God and man, he is not divided, but is one Christ.

He is united because God has taken humanity into himself; he does not transform deity into humanity.

He is completely one in the unity of his person, without confusing his natures.

For as the rational soul and body are one person, so the one Christ is God and man.

He suffered death for our salvation.

He descended into hell and rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all people shall rise bodily to give an account of their own deeds.

Those who have done good will enter eternal life, those who have done evil will enter eternal fire.

This is the catholic faith.

One cannot be saved without believing this firmly and faithfully.

Response: We lift them to the Lord.

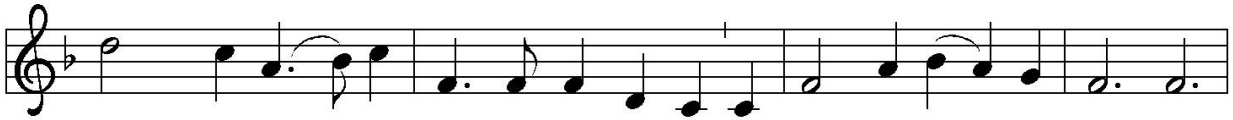

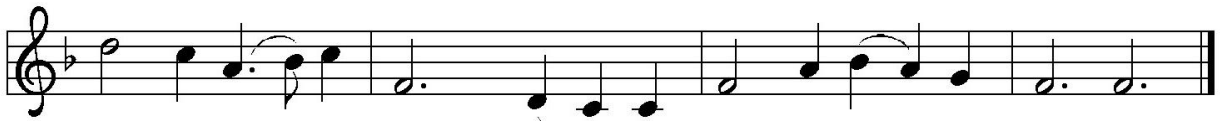
