### Greetings St. Paul Lutheran Church!

Yes, I know it is July and I am on Sabbatical, so you haven't seen me for awhile; but, I wrote this before I left. We won't be having an August newsletter, as is common for us, and since the deadline for the July newsletter was about when I was leaving I figured I would share one more message.

In May I helped with one of the Community Meals. I didn't need to serve the food, so I had a chance to talk with some of our guests. I was introduced to a new guest. It was known that he was a Cherokee Indian. I believe I am part Cherokee from my dad's side, but he never knew anyting about it and never wanted to look into it, so I was asking our guest how I could look into it a bit more. He shared with me a few ideas and places to go like Cherokee, NC, or the online Indian Affairs website. North Carolina is one of the few states I've never been to before, so I had no idea where Cherokee was. He then mentioned another town that is nearby called Bryson City. Still I didn't really know the area. The next day though I heard Bryson City mentioned again, but this time it was by one of our folks who were going to be traveling there.

When these types of things happen like this, I tend to take notice, and wondering if the Holy Spirit is speaking to me somehow about something. I still don't know what the Spirit is saying, but I did get googling ELCA churches in that area (no, not to move there but to see what God is already doing there). There is a church in Cherokee, NC, that is pastored by a mission developer. They have a lot of pictures on their Facebook page and it looks like they do a lot of ministries with the Cherokee Nation as well as having cultural immersion experiences. Many of their members are Cherokee, but they also have non-Cherokee members. I love their image - Hand in Hand over the baptismal waters.

One of the posts on their Facebook page was this:

A man whispered, "Creator speak to me" and a meadowlark sang. But the man did not hear.

So the man yelled, "Universe, speak to me" and the thunder rolled across the sky. But the man did not listen.

The man looked around and said, "Let me see you" and a star shined brightly. But the man did not see.

And the man shouted, "Show me a miracle" and a life was born. But the man did not notice. So, the man cried out in despair,

"Touch me, and let me know you are here." Whereupon, the Great Mystery touched that man. But the man brushed the butterfly away and walked on.

# Council News

The Congregation Council met for its regular monthly meeting on June 15, 2023, in person and by Zoom.

- The Congregation Council was introduced to a new program, Vision to Action - V2A which was presented at the recent Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly for goal setting innovations. Judy Carnal, Irene Felicetti, Marty Hillerich and Pastor Don Hillerich were in attendance and had attended the assembly. In addition, (Gail Seyfarth was also a voting member at the synod assembly) a video was shown to facilitate the council's understanding of V2A. The five goals to be considered are: Intentional Diversity, Sharing Christ, Making Disciples, Healthy Leaders, and Doing Justice. The initial agreement of the council is to get input of creative ideas from council members by June 25, form a task force to research possibilities for St. Paul, and when Pastor Ashley returns from Sabbatical to convene a congregational retreat to launch ways to expand, renew, reset, or revitalize ministries to work with entities in the community. Grants are available to congregations before the end of 2023 to fund its innovations.
- The Property Committee has been given a golf cart by Conrad Hellwege.
- The Social Ministry will be providing Alta Vista Elementary School with Walmart gift cards through donations before school begins in August.

## Rev. Pedro M. Suárez Re-Elected as Bíshop of the Florída-Bahamas Synod

Rev. Pedro M. Suárez was re-elected as bishop on June 8 on the first ballot during the Synod Assembly. Rev. Suárez has been serving as bishop of the Florida-Bahamas Synod since 2017. Throughout his tenure, he has been dedicated to initiatives to increase discipleship, inclusivity, and justice within the synod's 160 congregations.

Prior to becoming bishop, Suárez served as lead pastor of St. Stephen Lutheran Church in Pompano Beach, Florida, and as interim Director for Evangelical Mission for the Florida-Bahamas Synod. Previously, Suárez served in Texas, Illinois and in Wisconsin.

Speaking about his re-election, Suárez expressed his deep gratitude to the synod for their trust and support. "It is an honor to continue serving as bishop of this vibrant and diverse synod. I am committed to guiding our faith community with integrity, love, and a steadfast focus on God's mission," he said. "Together, we will strive to boldly share Christ, passionately make disciples, and faithfully do justice in our communities."





## <u>Update</u>

YES, the project has been delayed until March 8, 2024; but not the fund raising and the Renovation Building Committee's efforts. The delay was necessary due to the beams' construction and an evaluation of the best timing for the ECLC calendar. A meeting with the task force and architects set the date, and follow up sessions with projected items costs is being planned. In the meantime, representatives of the school and committee will be meeting with interested community foundations. Gifts of cash and pledges are arriving regularly. As of this date, June 17, \$265,399.71 has been received with \$184,926.71 placed in a new restricted account. All sized gifts and pledges for up to three years are appreciated. Incoming gifts will multiply in value with the restricted account and its interest.
