Just like last week with a prayer that was similar to the Lord's Prayer, changing Psalm 23 caused a lot of negative feedback. As Pr. Fred Melton shared with me and I concur, we could consider these prayers as additional spiritual prayers, along with, not in replacement for the traditional prayers/scriptures.
