Greetings St. Paul Lutheran Church!

I've been thinking a lot about our Raise the Roof! Raise the Kids! Campaign. While I know we are more in the behind the scenes stage of the campaign now, I've had good conversations with people outside of St. Paul about the project and its meaning and wanted to share some of my thoughts with you from these conversations. They got me excited, so I thought they may get you excited too.

I was at the awards dinner for the Sarasota Alliance for Historic Preservation. The person I was sitting next to was sharing about the historical connection between engineers/architects and priests/churches and how back in the early church days they were very much connected. I never realized the connection before, but it makes sense. Churches were the things being built, and they were trying to imitate the grandness of God in the buildings. The person I was sitting next to could articulate the wonder, awe, and majesty better than I can, so I only have my feelings from that conversation to convey. Nowadays, for many of us a building is a building is a building. It doesn't matter about the architecture. And while that is true, we can worship anywhere or even without a building. When we have such amazing buildings, I believe it is part of our calling to keep maintaining them to the architect's original vision. Where I worship is integral to my faith life. Seeing the beauty of the architecture helps me imagine the expansiveness of God. We're just humans and can create such splendor, how much more is God?

I had another conversation earlier that same week with another person that got me thinking about why we are doing this project. This person asked me if it drove me nuts that we were spending so much money on a building (probably instead of spending all of this money on feeding the hungry, etc). I told this person that it didn't bother me. I saw this "building" not just as a building but as an asset to the congregation and community. I've heard the story that back around 2013, St. Paul Lutheran Church was trying to decide if they remain in their current location or sell the property and move. The congregation chose at that time to engage and lean into being a community church. Part of that is our campus and our buildings. I hear the pain in people's voices when they talk about Sarasota buildings that were historically or architecturally significant and were torn down. A building isn't just a building. It holds history and memories and dreams of the future in it. And literally our Ed Building does hold the future as it is home to our Early Childhood Learning Center children. These buildings aren't just brick and mortar, but also our past, present, and future.

Thank you to all who have donated so far to the campaign. We did share last month that there is a delay in beginning the construction, and we were coming up with our Plan B. We had a taskforce that looked at all the pros and cons and ideas for when to begin the construction, since it could not begin at the end of May. Our taskforce recommended to council, and council approved, the construction to begin during Spring Break of 2024. We will order the beams ASAP, so they may even be ready before the construction begins. March 8, 2024, is now the plan for beginning construction. This has the least interruption to the Early Childhood Learning Center

school year. Once the kids come back from break they will be in the Fellowship Hall. I know we will figure out all the logistics. We have a good team of folks ensuring this happens. If you have questions, please let me know.

Talking with God






Pentecost Sunday was May 28!

Did you know...

Pentecost is a Greek word that means "50", regarding the Old Testament feast celebrated 50 days after Passover. Pentecost is celebrated by Christians 50 days after Easter. The Lord poured out His Spirit during Pentecost. Once exclusive to a select few, God's blessing extends to everyone. We have access to the love of the Father and Son. We are accepted into the most loving communion with the Father since we are united in Christ. That is a call to repentance due to the witness of the Holy Spirit.

The color red symbolizes Pentecost. Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday after Pentecost, is colored white. Green is the color of new life and development for the season.


