The Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly this year is June 12-14 in Orlando. This year's theme is from Ecclesiastes, "There is a time for everything."



I like the logo that includes the clock and the cross. It reminds me of the connection made from Psalm 23 that God is with us in every season of our lives. And it's not just every season, but every second, minute and hour.

May Council Report

Pastor Ashley presented additional information about the 2026 Vision2Action Synod grant following discussion with the grant process coach. The Letter of Intent will be submitted for the June 30, 2025, deadline as there is a lot of interest in the Spanish/ English classes that would be offered if funded.

Synod Assembly (June 11-14, 2025) representatives will be Marty Hillerich and Esther Smith.

Pastor Ashley reported that we received the final payment from the state for the Raise the Roof campaign.

Pastor Ashley said that donations to the Big Blue Bin for Simply Salvage have been steady. St. Paul and the ECLC will split the first check in the amount of \$220. St. Paul receipts will go towards the remaining balance of the Raise the Roof campaign. Continued donations are encouraged of all items except large furniture and appliances.

JoAnn Jordan and Judy Carnal continue to work on the Constitution changes. These will be submitted to the subcommittee in August; and the Congregation in September for a vote in December 2025.

VBS for this year will be held at St. Paul on July 28, 29, and 30. The theme is God's Creation.


